



WHAT IS NETWORKING?

AS A GROUP COME UP WITH A DEFINITION

WHAT IS NETWORKING

Networking is the action or process of interacting with others to exchange information and develop professional or social contacts.

Simply put networking is making connections with other people to build your relationships and grow within a business or profession.

CREATING YOUR Network: Business Email

If not you should create one now.

Make your address something that includes your first and last name or initials.

CREATING YOUR NETWORK: LINKEDIN

- Create a LinkedIn account
- Make sure your account has a profile picture, LEGAL first and last name and skills.
- Make sure to use the email address that we just created.

NOTES FOR LINKEDIN PROFILE

- Make your headline(the text below your profile picture) Student At Science Leadership Academy.
- Include job/position in headline(Cashier @ McDonalds).
- Don't worry about putting down your experiences.
- Don't make a summary now.

All ask for resumes and having a good resumé will make it easier to network with other people especially if they have experience in that particular field.



- Zip Code and State.
- Job Experiences
- Extracurricular
 - Activities (only for

college applications)

- GPA (if it's above a 3.0)
- High Schools Attended.
- Skills and Headline.

GAP YEAR

WHAT IS A GAP YEAR?

A gap year is when you take a year off, typically between high school graduation and college. So instead of beginning college the fall after you finish high school, you'd start the following fall. Gap years are meant to give students a break from academics.

WHY DO A GAP YEAR

Some colleges and universities offer gap year programs for students and will even allow you to defer your acceptance for a year. Some programs will allow you to travel abroad and/or complete internships during this period.

You can also choose to not participate in any of these programs and work for a year before you go to college.

PROS AND CONS OF JOINING THE ARMY



- It is a commitment that is (almost) unbreakable.
- It can become life-threatening really fast and result in physical and psychological damage.
- You have no choice with what you'll be asked to do
- You'll be away from your loved ones.
- You must stay in PEAK physical condition.

PROS

- Most if not all of college tuition will be covered.
- Gives you the opportunity to travel.
- While active duty you will receive dental and medical care.
- If you serve longer than 20 years you become eligible for a lifelong pension.
- Provides a sense of direction at a young age.

2 YEAR COLLEGE OPTIONS

2 YEAR/ COMMUNITY COLLEGE

When most people talk about college it's as a 4 year experience but they often forget that you can graduate in 2 years at some colleges!

ASSOCIATE'S DEGREE

An associates degree is often given at 2 year colleges after completion. Although not as useful as bachelor's degree it costs significantly less. Entry requirements for these programs will be less competitive and stressful. You can also transfer your degree to a bachelor's if you chose too!




