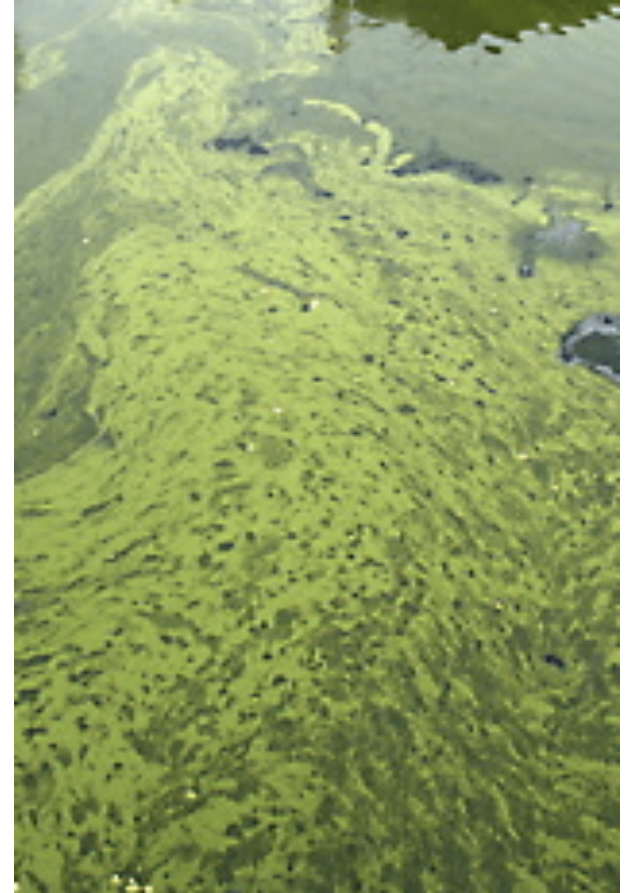
ANALYSIS:
