"To be, or not to be: that is the question: Whether 'tis nobler in the mind to suffer The slings and arrows of outrageous fortune"



scared he don't know what to do next. he has a worried tone.





He is stuck on what to do; worried




Pain and Heartache

he is worried and could be in pain.




