


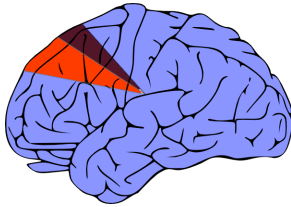


Macbeth's Brain Under the Influence

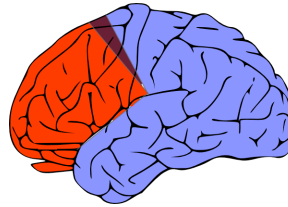
Act I



"If we should fail?" (Act I.7), Line 60)

Macbeth cautiously considers Lady Macbeth's plan to kill King Duncan.

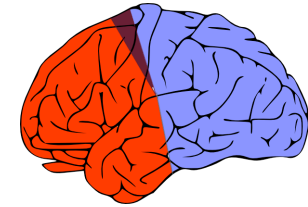
Act II



"These deeds must not be thought after these ways. So, it will make us sad" (Act II.2), Lines 34-35)

Shortly after this, Macbeth does what Lady Macbeth says without hesitation.

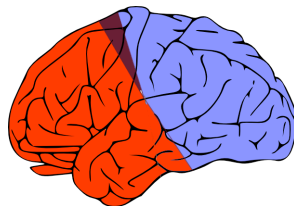
Act III



"Ay, in the catalogue ye go for men..." (Act III.1), Line 92)

Macbeth starts to take on Lady Macbeth's verbal traits.

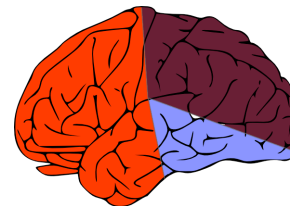
Act IV



"...give to the edge o' th' sword his wife, his babes, and all unfortunate souls" (Act IV.1), Line 173)

Macbeth starts taking on not just verbal traits but actual characteristics of Lady Macbeth as well.

Act V



"I bear a charmed life which must not yield to one of woman born" (Act V.8, Lines 12-13)

Macbeth follows the witches' prophecies to the letter. He lets the prophecies make decisions for him.
