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By a significant 12-point margin, 42 percent to 30 percent, a greater proportion of young Republicans say they are definitely going to vote in November

than young Democrats-

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Roughly one-in-four (26%) young Americans under the age of 30 say that they will "definitely be voting" in the fall, a very similar proportion to that seen during a similar time period prior to the 2010 midterm elections (27%: Sept.
