"Currently our prime suspects are the two guards that were stationed at the main entrance," says King Duncan's head guard.

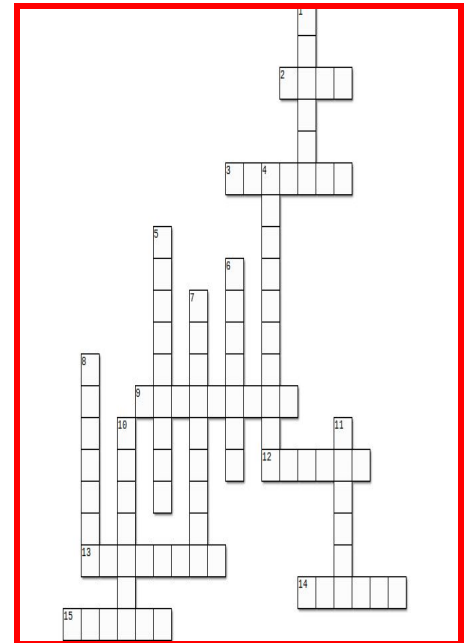
