

What's Printmaking? Printmaking is the way to creating artwork by transfer the artwork from the paper by using, different tools. Printmaking's can apply the color in the print in different ways too.

The first country that uses the process as a way to print images multiple times were Chinese. Germany became the center for woodblock printing in the 15th century, and in the 16th century, Durer became a master engraver. Italian printmaking was dominated by the northern city.

Printmaking has many different types: Relief Printing, Intaglio, Lithography, Serigraphy, and Mono - Printing. Relief printing is different from other forms of printmaking because relief print is woodcut, linocut, and wood engraving. Relief print and intaglio print is different because intaglio print need a printer press and relief print don't. But in the end, the result look similar but the technique to get the ink onto the paper is really different.
