
Maddy Malloy's Emulation Handbook

What's this element?

This quote is the most significant quote in the book. Overall it portrays the feeling of Simon revealing his sexuality to others which is the main struggle of the whole book. Although this struggle with Simon is really only about him, it also affects other people in a way of how people will perceive him. More specifically, he is struggling with the idea of how others will react with the knowledge of his sexuality.

The reader understands what Simon is going through. It is hard for people who have their sexual identity hidden because others do not react well. The reader should feel understanding and compassion for what Simon is going through. The author displays a sort of suspense in what is going through the character's mind by telling us that his thoughts are keeping him awake.

THE DEFINITION:

Limited Omniscient—is usually limited to one character's thoughts or feelings, but can switch POV, usually at the start of a new section or chapter. There is also a limit to what the narrator knows, unlike the omniscient narrator who often knows everything.

Tone/Voice

What's this element?

The author is using the main character's thought process in a sarcastic connotation, making the text funny. Here the author starts off the book by giving it the essence of comedy, providing entertainment for the reader.

Why does it matter?

This quote is important to the book because it gives the genre of what you're about to read; comedy. It gives the reader a sense of what type of book this is. Not only does this do this though, it also portrays what kind of person the main character is.

"Well. I'd say the point of the fake name was to keep people like Martin Addison from knowing my secret identity. So I guess that worked out brilliantly." (pg 1-2)

What's the impact on the reader?

This makes the reader have a feel for what the character is, and what his personality is like.

This quote makes the reader feel entertained because of the way the author incorporated sarcasm into this quote. The author does this by

The narrator's attitude toward the characters and/or events.

Scenery/Surroundings

What's this element?

The author uses very descriptive words, and detailed observations about the people around Simon. Everything that they are wearing, their hair, facial expressions, etc., are described to make the story more vivid. The author makes a visual for the reader of what the surrounding of the scene they are reading, and also provides context in what the thought process of Simon is like.

Why does it matter?

This quote in the story is significant because it gives you a visual on Simon's perspective. The reader interprets how the main character thinks, and captures the character's personality. The author does this by providing details of how the character looks in Simon's perspective.

"I sit and Leah slides down the wall next to me, leaning against it with her legs tucked awkwardly to the side. She's wearing a skirt with her costume, and I can tell she's trying to keep her thighs from showing. Which is so ridiculous and so Leah. I scoot close to her, and she smiles a little bit without looking at me." (page 46)

What's the impact on the reader?

This quote makes the author know that the main character is very descriptive in what he thinks. The surroundings are described as perfectly as possible, so the reader understands what is happening in this scene.
