PLOT

PLOT SEQUENCE

What's this element?

Why does it matter?

Because there was a cause (trash talking) that made this hit more impactful. What's the impact on the reader?

This makes the reader feel the tension before the hit. The author intended to build up the moment with the trash talker as the instigator. The moment when the heckler quarterback got hit, he described the vicious hit being like "A crash dummy hitting the wall." Then he adds "The crowd gasps." This makes me as a reader think about the crushing impact on the quarterback.

UNIQUE CHAPTER NAMES


What's this element?



Why does it matter?

The title is important because it keeps a reader interested. A good author lures you in with a clever and witty title as a sneak preview for what's to come. What's the impact on the reader?
