

[Book-Based: Narration] What's this element?

The author uses Narration as a tool, we know this since he constantly gives relevant information about the events he was seen, and interacted with. What the author is doing here is exploiting a lot of pressure to the reader, but not too much that the reader is unable to have access to their personal lives. This is important to the audience of readers because they want to listen to a different story for once. Sometimes people start to have enough of winning, it's just the full nature of a human, they want to see struggles that can connect to their world, making them not feel disconnected or left out. Just like a 5-year-old kid would not think it is fair for a group of kids his age to go outside, but he's prohibited. Another thing the author is doing is taking bits and pieces of people's quotes, and requoting them in a way that would make sense to an audience, that's why you find in AMERICA'S GAME there's a lot more analysis than context.

Why does it matter?

It is important overall because it means that it brings attention to the audience, and that makes anyone that encounters it to want to read more and take something from it, a valuable lesson or change. The chronology of the words visually really shows a lot, when you encounter a page with many paragraphs you have the thought that something important is about to take place. When MacCambridge starts to speak about the relationship between fans and athletes it really opens up a new world of people, he explains it as "a greater self-awareness on both sides of the equation" which when you think about it makes sense, because if you've missed understood one part of the equation odd's are that your answer will be incorrect.



What's the impact on the reader?

The element of interest makes the reader know the feeling of having to go through all these struggles as McCambridge, a struggle most would rather be blind to because they are aware of the dangers it could bring to their lives. I selected this section of the novel to analyze because it shows some use of commas which the author does a lot of.

What's this element?

The author here is organizing the book mostly chronologically, but with a few flashbacks. These flashbacks serve to give a brief moment of importance, or timing, an example being the flashback of the cool winter when the Cleveland Rams and the Washington redskins faced off, this shows that this game was significant for Americans. Ever since the very beginning of the novel we see the style of organization take place.

Why does it matter?

There was a lot of descriptive writing. The reader is almost brought back to the 1900's when football played a big role just like baseball with Jackie Robinson. McCambridge takes advantage of literary devices such as setting, tone, mood and most importantly foreshadowing. He writes long paragraphs that give a lot of background information, but in order to prevent the reader from being lost he uses commas to prevent run-ons. The quotes centralize their attention to the Rams surprising achievements, they've never been the best team, but they never gave up so they succeeded.



What's the impact on the reader?

This element makes the reader reflect on the brutal yet natural cold environment, and really makes you feel as if you were put in the author's shoes. What's this element?

Why does it matter?
