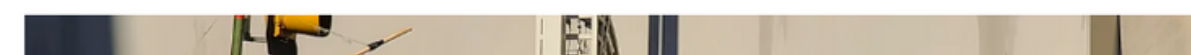
Even if Kenney's rivals combined their votes, they still would have lost by more than 15 percentage points.

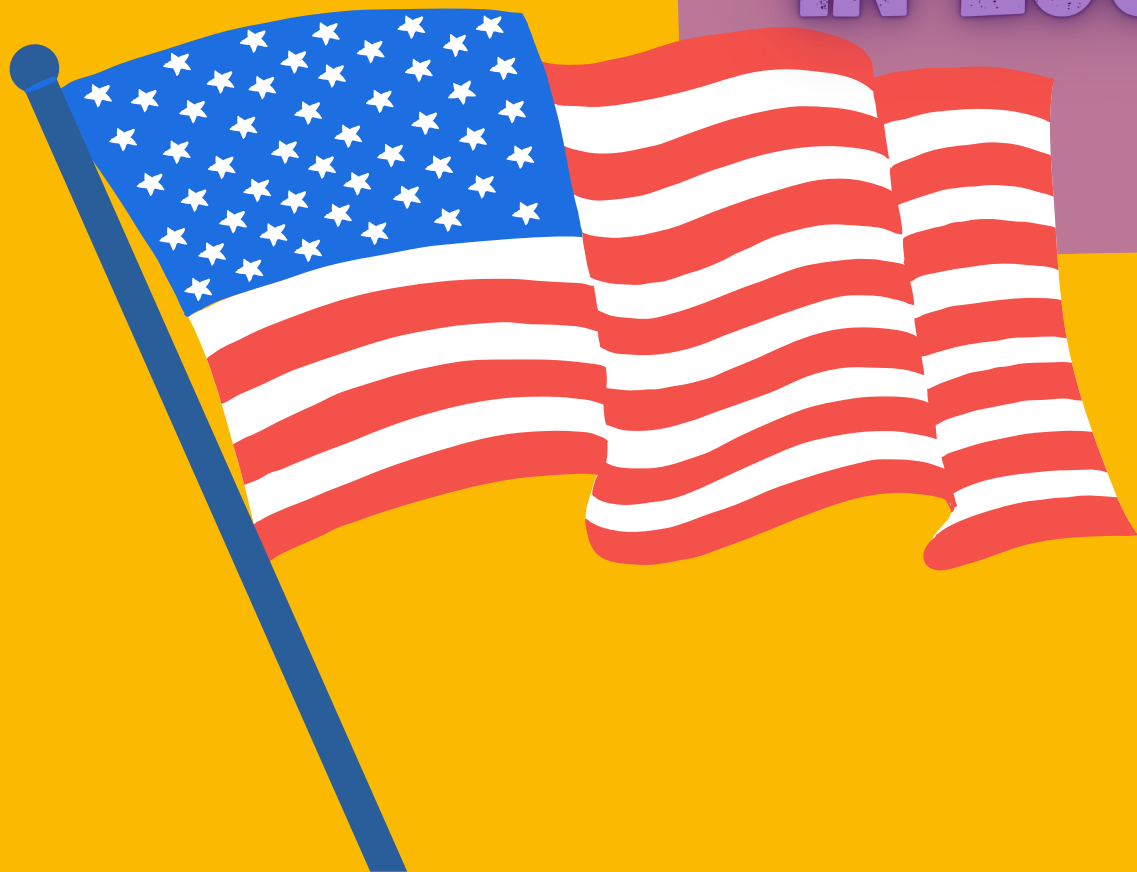
