What Is Phillybolt?

Philly bolt is a youth program that **instills** participants the possibility of **change**, cultivates their commitment to leading that **change** and helps them learn what they need to be comfortable pursuing leadership roles. Focusing on serving public school youth, focusing on those residing in predominantly BIPOC, **low-income neighborhoods**.

Program Goals and Structure

- What are the desired outcomes for students participating in the program (e.g. improved academic performance, social-emotional skills, exposure to new interests)?
- How will the program balance structured activities with opportunities for student-driven inquiry?
- What resources (materials, technology, field trips) are needed to facilitate inquiry-based learning experiences?

Student Engagement

- How will the program spark students' curiosity and motivate them to ask questions about topics of interest?
- What strategies will be used to guide students in developing researchable questions and planning investigations?
- How will students be supported in conducting research, analyzing data, and drawing conclusions?

Presentation and Reflection

- How will students share and present their inquiry projects (e.g. presentations, exhibits, performances)?
- What opportunities will students have to reflect on their learning process, successes, and challenges?
- How can families and the community be involved in celebrating students' inquiry work?

Assessment and Evaluation

- What formative and summative assessments will measure students' growth in inquiry skills and content knowledge?
- How will the program evaluate its effectiveness in meeting stated goals and student needs?
- What processes will be in place to continuously improve the inquiry-based learning experiences?

05 Reflection

- Recognize the importance of lived experiences: PhillyBOLT values the local knowledge and lived experiences of community members, who deeply understand the challenges and needs of their neighborhoods[1]. Their grassroots approach empowers those directly impacted to lead social change efforts.
- Appreciate the dedication of grassroots leaders: The site highlights how grassroots leaders often take on multiple jobs and pay out of pocket to test models that provide critical community services[1]. Their unwavering commitment stems from serving their own neighbors, friends, and families.
- Understand the impact on youth: The program data shows significant increases in participants' confidence in public speaking (16% increase) and belief in their ability to bring change to their communities (10% increase). This demonstrates the positive influence on empowering the next generation of leaders.
- Consider the value of trust and local context: Grassroots leaders are trusted by their neighbors and deeply immersed in the community context. This local embeddedness is crucial for effective and sustainable social change efforts.
