




"For brave Macbeth - well he deserves that name..."

Macbeth is unsure if he is doing the right thing, and his inner conflict is taking its toll on him.


"Something wicked this way comes..."

Macbeth has decided to attack and kill everyone in Macduff's castle, his family and servants, just because the witches said to "fear Macduff."


"Fit to govern? No, not to live!"

"...Like a giants robe upon a dwarfish thief..."




"The devil damn thee black thou cream-faced loon! Where got'st thou that goose
